Early Barton Family - DNA Research

- > or his great great grandson John Barton b 1600 Barton in the Beans, Leicestershire (before emigrating to the British Colonies in New England
 - or any of the sons of the above people coming forward in time
 (Presuming the Barton surname wasn't inherited from an illegitimate child of one of the Barton daughters, or similar scenario)

Despite reaching far back into history, the life of Andrew Barton is quite well documented.

This has come about because he had come from quite a significant family and he was a Member of Parliament in the British "House of Commons".

Using his Biography and other sources Andrew Barton's life story is expanded in a separate story:

Andrew Barton was born c1498, at Smithills Hall, Lancashire, the first son of:

- > John Barton of Smithills, Lancashire and
- Cecily (nee Radcliffe) daughter and heir of Ralph Radcliffe of Smithills, Lancashire.

Barton Background

Before reaching Andrew Barton there is considerable documentation relating to earlier Barton generations that played a significant role in the history of England in the 1400's

➤ JOHN BARTON (1425–1491) - [great-grandfather of Andrew Barton]

John Barton was a wool merchant.

He was born in Lancashire and established himself as a hugely successful merchant for the "Staple of Calais".

The Company of Merchants of the Staple of England, the Merchants of the Staple, also known as the Merchant Staplers, was an English company incorporated by Royal Charter in 1319 (and so the oldest mercantile corporation in England) dealing in <u>wool</u>, <u>skins</u>, <u>lead</u> and <u>tin</u> which controlled the export of wool to the continent during the late <u>medieval</u> period.

After accumulation a considerable of wealth and property, John Barton (1425 - 1491) later moved to Holme, Nottinghamshire where he died.

The restoration of *St Giles Church at Holme*, *Nottinghamshire* pays tribute to the life of John Barton.


➤ RALPH BARTON (1450-1486) - [grandfather of Andrew Barton]

The Bartons were a Nottinghamshire family which acquired further extensive Lancashire estates through the marriage of Andrew Barton's grandfather:

Ralph Barton to **Johanna Radcliffe** (1452-1487), an heiress of the Radcliffes of Smithills.

> JOHN BARTON (1470-1517) - [father of Andrew Barton]:

also married a Radcliffe, Cecily Radcliffe (who was his cousin).
