The Parr family had their origins as *de Parre* indicating their likely move from France to England during the reign of William the Conqueror.

The de Parre family became associated with Kendal Castle in Westmoreland, England (Westmoreland is now Cumbria), when Sir William de Parre married in 1383 to Elizabeth de Ros [daughter of John de Ros, and granddaughter and heiress of Sir Thomas de Ros, Baron of Kendal, Westmoreland]. The Parr family inherited Kendal Castle through Elizabeth de Ros.

Our 12<sup>th</sup> Great Grandparents were Elizabeth Parr who married John Daingerfield Belfield. Elizabeth Parr was born on 20 June 1529 at Kendal Castle, the daughter of Baron Sir Knight William Parr and Lady Baroness Mary Alice Salisbury. William Parr was a military man who fought in France, where he was knighted by King Henry VIII in the Notre-Dame Cathedral at Tournai, Belgium.
