
Johannes Carey & Maria Power - Cahir, Tipperary, Ireland

JOANNES CAREY and MARIA POWER - [John Carey & Mary Power]

The origin of our ancestor Mary Carey had, for many years, remained somewhat a mystery.

Persistent family history research, over a period of 45 years, along with the rapid advancements and availability of:

- Computerised Family History Research
- DNA Technology

has given me confidence in *finally confirming the parentage* and early background of our ancestor Mary Carey.

The Life Story of Mary Carey is COMPLEX as documentation is scarce and there are many 'twists and turns' in her Life Story!

A brief summary of the life of Mary Carey is provided in timeline format:

- Mary Carey born in Ireland c1819 (as per death certificate died aged 48 years in 1867)
- ➤ Mary Carey arrived in Australia from Ireland c1837 (as per death certificate 30 years in the Colony of NSW)
- Mary Carey gave birth to a son John Carey (later named and baptised as John Jones)
 - born 28 April 1839 (as per baptismal certificate sourced 23 September 2004)
 - baptised 12 May 1839 (as per baptismal certificate sourced 23 September 2004)
- ▶ 13 May 1839 (the day following the baptism of her child John Carey (later John Jones)
- > Mary Carey was granted permission to marry convict Joseph Jones (they, however, did not marry!)
- > 21 Mar 1843 Mary Carey gave birth to a son Patrick Thomas Malone at Goulburn
- > 6 June 1845 Mary Carey gave birth to a daughter Mary Catherine Malone at 'Fish River' (Gunning district)
- > 27 July 1846 Mary Carey married Patrick Malone (convict per ship 'Hero' 1835) at St Peter & St Paul Church, Goulburn
- > 27 July 1846 children Patrick Thomas Malone and Mary Catherine Malone were both baptised (same day as marriage) at St Peter & St Paul Church, Goulburn

John Jones (half-brother and business partner of Patrick Thomas Malone)		

- > 3 July 1847 Patrick Malone (Convict) died at Goulburn Hospital) at the age of c35 years, leaving his wife Mary (nee Carey) and three young children
- ➤ 21 July 1849 Mary Malone (nee Carey) was to again marry at St Saviour's Church of England, Goulburn. Her husband was Joseph Jones (a former convict per shop 'John [4] who arrived in the Colony of New South Wales in 1832)
- ➤ 16 August 1849 Mary Carey's son John <u>Carey</u> was baptised at St Peter's and St Paul's Church at Goulburn as a Catholic and took on the surname of his new stepfather and became John <u>Jones</u>
- > 20 October 1864 Joseph Jones (2nd husband of Mary Carey/Malone), a carrier from Goulburn died at 'Burrangong Station' near Young [Lambing Flat Goldfield]. He died from "vascular disease of the heart and asthma".
- > 26 August 1867 Mary Jones (previously Malone-nee Carey) passed away on 26th August 1867 at Garroorigang, Goulburn.

<u>Mary Carey - the Forty Year Breakthrough</u>

What was the origin of Mary Carey? Who were her parents?

On 27 January 2024, Australia Day had passed, and I was casually looking at a few Ancestry DNA matches on my Samsung tablet – nothing too exciting. My wife Pam and I both had our Ancestry DNA tests done back in 2016, so I had been looking at and sorting out our DNA matches for over 8 years.

Catching my attention, was a DNA match, Joy Moore.


The DNA match indicated Joy Moore was related to me as follows:

- Paternal side (father's side)
- Estimated 4th-6th Cousin
- DNA 23cM (centimorgans unit of DNA measurement) 1 Segment (estimated one common ancestor)

From Joy Moore I chose to look into the Walsh / Welsh family line in order to see where that family lead as that family name often appeared in DNA matches on both my Paternal and Maternal family line.


Joy's mother Frances Welsh and grandfather Michael Patrick Welsh appeared to have been born in New Zealand.

Great grandfather Stephen Welsh was purportedly born on 26 December 1945 in Tipperary, Ireland.



The Roots Ireland baptismal document lists Stephen Walsh as:

- <u>Baptised</u> 10 December 1845 (not <u>born</u> 26 December 1845)
- Newcastle Parish, Waterford (Newcastle is on the Waterford / Tipperary border)
- Roman Catholic
- Parents William Walsh (Welsh) and Margaret Carey (Carry)
- Baptismal Sponsors: William Hackett and Catherine McGrath





The Ireland, Catholic Parish Registers, 1655-1915 are extracted from the Original Documents, written in Latin

Stephanus Walsh

- Baptismal date 26 December 1845 is verified
- Newcastle is attached to both Counties, Tipperary and Waterford
- Father is listed as Guillelmus Walsh (translated as Bill, William)
- Mother as Margarita Carry (Margaret Carey)

The Roots Ireland Marriage Record lists:

Margaret Carey had married William Walsh on 22 October 1836 at Ardfinnan Parish, Tipperary.

Witnesses for the ceremony were Maurice Carrigan and Maria Barret / Barrett.



The next document, when viewed ticked a number of boxes.

For quite some time, there had been research work done, that indicated that there may be quite a distinct possibility that the **mother** of my ancestor Mary Carey was **Mary Power**.

The death certificate of Mary Carey had already indicated her father's name as John Carey.

The baptismal record of **Margaret Carey** below showed 2 names:



If this is the correct baptismal document, Margaret Carey was born c1813, making her 23 years of age when she married William Walsh (above).

John Carey and Mary Power

Moving to John Carey and Mary Power we come across an important marriage document.




Figure 2: Original Marriage Document Joannes Carew & Maria Power

The original document is transcribed from Latin as below:


Johannes Carew (John Carew {John Carey}) married Maria Power (Mary Power) in the New Inn Knockgraffon Parish, Tipperary Ireland on 10 February 1818.

Another box is ticked as the marriage in 1812 followed by the birth of daughter Margaret Carey in 1813 seems quite a logical sequence of events.

There was another DNA match relating back to:

John Carey and Mary Power

The DNA match was with "Kathleen Carey"



It was quite some time ago that **Kathleen Carey** came up on Ancestry as a 4th-6th Cousin DNA match.

Her family tree led to an **Edmund Carey**:

- ✓ born 2 March 1822 in Ireland
- ✓ married Mary Reilly
- ✓ died 18 August 1896 in USA

The date on the above Baptismal Record (Roots Ireland) is entered in the birth column and not the baptismal column.

Edmund Carey was born 2 March 1822 (as per US, Find a Grave cemetery inscription) and he was probably baptised the next day on 3 March 1822 at Cahir Parish, Tipperary.

Edmund's parents were listed as John Carey and Mary Power, thus very convincingly indicating that Edmund Carey was a brother of both Margaret Carey.

The close DNA matches and appropriateness of the birth timeline therefore suggested that my ancestor Mary Carey may have been a sibling as well.




Figure 3: Edmund Carey & Family 1880 US Census




Figure 4: Edmund & Mary Carey - Headstone - Wilmington, Illinois

Mapping

- ❖ John Carrey married Maria Power in the New Inn & Knockgraffon Parish, (southern) Tipperary
- **Most** of the Carey Children were Baptised in the Cahir Parish, (southern) Tipperary
- * The parishes "New Inn & Knockgraffon" and "Cahir" are neighbouring Parishes!




Figure 5: Parishes of Tipperary

* Margaret Carey (who appears to be the eldest child) was baptised in Clashmore Parish in the nearby county of Waterford, which is approximately 50km from Cahir, Tipperary, where it appears the other siblings were baptised.



Figure 6: Parishes of Waterford


Were there other Children of Johannes (John) Carey and Maria (Mary) Power?


At this stage no documentation has been found for the baptism of our ancestor Mary Carey. However other documents have been uncovered below that indicate there were additional siblings in the above family. One issue is quite evident, the name Carey was spelt in a variety of ways {Keary, Carew etc}.








There appears to be a second John Carey born to John Carey and Mary Power, generally indicating that the first John Carey was most likely deceased in early childhood.

An Ancestry message to Katherine Mutschler (nee Carey) of Illinois, USA on 3 April 2024 was met the following day with a marvellous response:

Kate is a descendant of Edmund Carey and she wrote the following mind-blowing reply to my query:

"Wow! This is wonderful!!! Most of my information came from a family history written by Ellen (Nellie) Carey Ryan - one of Edmund's daughters - and was passed down to my uncle.

The only information I had about Mary and her sister Ann was that they "Left Cahir for Australia and were never heard from".

I only found information about John and Mary (Power) Carey, through a Facebook group, Irish Genealogy Ancestors Research. If you haven't checked them out, you should. They have been a valuable source when I run into brick walls. And I believe that one of the admins is located in Australia.


Migration of the Carey Siblings

Edmund Carey

Edmund Carey chose to join the many Irish Migrants to seek a better life in the USA.

As with most migrants, the pathway generally led from Ireland to the English Port of Liverpool and then to the seas beyond – they were extremely courageous!

Edmund Carey arrived in New York, USA on 29 April 1852.



Missing Brother – 'Missing Friends - Boston Post 1854-1856'

In the "Boston Post" published sometime between 1854-1856, the following article appeared with Edmund (Edmond) Carey enquiring regarding the whereabouts of his young brother Thomas Carey!

OF THOS CAREY, of Cahir, co Tipperary, aged 17 yrs, who landed in N Y 5 yrs ago last April; when last heard from (1 yr last fall) was in Morrow Town of Ohio. Information of him will be received by his brother EDMOND, Lewiston P O, Niagara co, N Y.
